will be for the individual, class and family photos. On Monday 16 March students in our Support Unit will have their individual and class photos taken. Full school uniform,


including black shoes and white socks should be worn on these days.

# - Feedback Survey

I am delighted that this term, our school, like many other public schools in the state, will participate in a Department of Education initiative: Tell Them From Me



student feedback survey. The survey measures factors that are known to affect academic achievement and other student outcomes. The focus of the NSW-wide survey is on student wellbeing, engagement and effective teaching practices.

The survey is a great opportunity for our students to provide us with valuable and quick feedback on what they think about school life, how engaged they are with school and the different ways that teachers interact with them. More than 6,300 schools in Australia and around the world have used Tell Them From Me to survey 5.4 million students. Capturing the voices of our students will help improve how we do things at our school.

I want to assure you that the survey is confidential. The survey is conducted online and will typically take less than 30 minutes to complete. It will be administered during school hours between 23 March and 8 May. Participating in the survey is entirely voluntary.

A consent form and FAQs for parents/carers about the survey will be sent home with students this week. If you do not want your child or children to participate, please return the form to school by Friday 20 March.

#### **NAPLAN - 2020**

In May 2020, the National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) will be completed by students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9.



NAPLAN has the support of all State and Territory Education Ministers and will assess the literacy and numeracy skills of students across Australian schools.

The results of the tests will provide valuable information to schools about what each student can do, and will be used to support teaching and learning programs. Parents will receive a report indicating their child's level of achievement. Each student's level of achievement will be reported against the national minimum standard.

# Crossing the Road - Dangerously!



In recent weeks I have had many parents approach me concerned at the unsafe behaviour of

adults and children who are choosing to cross Lily Street at random points along the road and not making use of the wombat crossing. Please understand that this practice is extremely dangerous and that with one small move left or right, we are going to have a significant accident that should have been avoided. Parents, I urge you to support our school in insisting the students cross at the crossing. You may feel that it takes too long to walk to the crossing then double back to the entrance of the school, but I can guarantee you all that no amount of time saved is worth an injury to you or your child because you refused to cross the road safely. We are talking and teaching about safety regularly in our classes, let's lead by example.

Please also be mindful of parking across private driveways, we have many local residents frustrated at not being able to enter or exit their premises.

Something else to remember is that **the Kiss and Drop Zone** is exactly that. Parents are **NOT** to park there
whilst they take their children into school. Please respect
the rules that are in place for everyone's convenience
and safety.

Newsletter - Library News - Term 1 Week 6

Welcome back to another exciting year in our amazing Library at William Stimson!

During Week 4, all classes had their first library lesson for 2020!

All students are currently participating in a 'Library Orientation' program. Students will become familiar with the library, how to care for our books, library rules, internet safety, our library management system Oliver, Premier's Reading Challenge, borrowing and returning procedures.

<u>Library Bags and Borrowing</u> - I encourage all parents/carers to purchase a school library bag from our office for \$5.00 as they are the BEST protection for our books. Alternatively, material bags from Kmart, Target or Big W are acceptable. Please ensure your child's library bag is clearly labelled with their full name on it.

Students borrow on their Library days below:

Monday - Year 1 and Year 2

Tuesday - Year 5 and Year 6

Wednesday - Support Unit, Year 3 and Year 4

Friday - Kindergarten

Please be advised if a student does not return their books after a few weeks, a note will be sent home. Also, notes are sent home to students requesting payment for lost or damaged books. This money contributes towards the purchase of replacement books.



Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) - The Premier's Reading Challenge (PRC) has started! All students are encouraged to participate and complete this year's challenge by 28 August 2020. Last year, we had 237 students complete the challenge.

The PRC is not a competition but a challenge to each student - to read, to read more and to read more widely. It aims to encourage in students a love of reading for leisure and pleasure and to enable them to experience quality literature.

This week, classes discussed the 2020 PRC, for example, where to locate PRC books and how to identify the PRC ID number. All students received their personal reading logs with detailed instructions on how to complete the challenge online. K-2 students received an orange card

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and 3-6 received a yellow card. These cards must be completed and returned to Miss Lavorato for validation. Students will receive their certificates signed by the Premier in Term 4.
